Mayor Webster called the meeting to order at 7:09 p.m.

Roll Call: Councilwoman Angela Scott, Councilmen Antonio Greer, Jeffrey Thomas, James Lowery, City Clerk LaNeesha Crockett, Recorder Megan Wilhoite, City Attorney Curtis Walker, and Mayor Charles Webster.

Absent: Councilmen Cassius Moore, Emanuel Harris

The motion to accept the agenda for November 7, 2023, was made by Councilman Thomas, 2nd by Councilman Greer. All voted I, motion passed.

Reading of Minutes: Minutes of October 3, 2023, were read by Recorder Wilhoite. Motion was made by Councilman Greer, 2nd by Councilman Thomas, to accept the minutes. All voted I, motion passed.

Financial Reports: A motion was made by Councilman Thomas, 2nd by Councilwoman Scott, to accept the Financial Statements for October 1-31, 2023. All voted I, motion passed. It was motioned by Councilman Greer, 2nd by Councilman Thomas, to accept the Bank Reconciliation Reports for September 2023. All voted I, motion passed.

Committee Reports: Fire: Councilman Greer announced that the fire department had a successful Trunk or Treat and distribution of Fire Prevention Week goods. He stated how excited the younger children were to learn more about fire safety and how to spot and react when it's seen. He shared how he set up a fog machine behind a closed door and had the children look under the door to see the smoke and showed them what to do in the event that they came upon smoke, announcing how to call 911 and ask for help. Councilman Greer presented an idea to the Council to reward the department for their hard work, asking to give the firefighters \$250 each at the end of the year as a thank you. Mayor Webster will work on the costs and get back to the Councilman. Pertaining to the ACT 833 funding, Mr. Greer stated he has contacted Louis Eckelhoff several times but has received no word or response.

Police: Councilman Thomas stated that no one had completed the part-time two police course, but he has spoken to a Jonesboro Police Department officer who is willing to work weekends to help the City.

Dollar General Store: A new client **is** in contact with the developer; we're still waiting to hear word from either of them.

Ordinance No. 85-6 Privilege Licenses for Operation of Occupations and Business in the City of Turrell, AR: City officials are looking into this Ordinance to determine if the Funeral Home/Crematorium and Ali's Store should be charged for each sublet of the building since each business provides different services. As for yard/rummage sales, the costs and length of each license approved will later be determined.

New Business: Mayor Webster's Report

Taylor Sudden Service Customer Application—614 Hwy 77 North, West Memphis, AR 72301

Resolution No. 2023.11.07A—**Authorizing Application:** The Resolution is that the City of Turrell can have the required maintenance done to the generator, per the quote from Taylor Sudden Service Inc. Councilman Thomas read the Resolution aloud. Councilman Thomas made the motion to authorize the application, 2nd by Councilwoman Scott. All voted I, motion passed.

Resolution No. 2023.11.07B – Amending the City and Rescue Budgets for the purpose of claiming Employee's Salaries and Employer Contributions and Other Expenses: Using the remaining funds from the American Rescue Plan Act, the mayor is requesting this Resolution to increase the city's budget while decreasing the City General Fund expenditures in the salary budget by \$69, 985.79. This money is available and will be used in other areas, such as a \$30,000 down payment towards the new garbage truck and \$6,000 toward the renovation of the pump stations. Councilman Greer made the motion to accept this Resolution, and it was 2nd by Councilwoman Scott. All voted I, motion passed.

Retail Water Provider Board Reminders: Act 605 of 2021—Act 545 Approved on April 11, 2023: Mayor Webster requests Communities Unlimited to perform the required rate study. This will be discussed later so the mayor and City Attorney can write a new Ordinance.

Watershed Community Meeting: The next meeting is set for December 6, 2023 in Gilmore.

To Whom It May Concern:

The City of Turrell in Arkansas owns and operates its water and sewer facilities as a single, interrelated municipal undertaking. The city has decided to extend and improve the system to ensure its residents have access to sufficient and proper water and sewer services.

The City Council has established monthly rates and charges for water services that are considered fair and reasonable, as well as minimum rates that should be charged for the provision of water through the system. This is in accordance with Ordinance No. 2002.3, Section 1.

The water usage of each customer will be measured monthly by a meter, and the amount to be paid will be determined based on the following rate schedule.

To ensure accurate measurement of water usage, a meter should be installed at every water connection point, excluding fire hydrants, whenever possible. Only one user should use each connection point, and dual connections are not allowed. In the case of multi-family housing, each apartment or house should be considered as a separate user. This is in accordance with Ordinance No. 2002, Sections 3 and 4.

Starting January 1, 2024, you will be billed for residential water and sewer usage based on the number of units. (Ordinance No. 2020.1006)

WHEREAS, the City of Turrell, Arkansas (the "City") owns and operates water and sewer facilities, which water and sewer facilities are operated as one interrelated municipal undertaking (the "System"), and has determined that extensions, betterments and improvements to the System (the "improvements") should be made in order that the City and its inhabitants may have adequate and proper water and sewer facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has had prepared by a duly qualified consulting engineer a preliminary report and estimates of costs of the improvements, which have been examined and approved by the City Council and are on file with the City Recorder where they may be inspected by any interested person; and

WHEREAS, the costs will have to be paid from the proceeds of revenue bonds; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City to establish rates to be charged for the services of the System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Turrell, Arkansas:

- Section 1. That the following monthly rates and charges which the City Council hereby finds and declares are fair, reasonable and minimum rates to be charged for water services be, and they are hereby, fixed as rates for water services to be rendered by the System.
- (A) Monthly Water Rates. The water usage of each customer shall be determined each month by meter measurement and the amount to be paid by each customer shall be computed on the basis of the following schedule of rates:

For the first 1,500 gallons of water consumption per month, or portion thereof

B.00 (minimum)

The lowest rate per 1,000 gallons will be adjusted as necessary to assure the rate is greater than the Cost of Operation and maintenance per 1,000 gallons.

- (b) Tapping Fee. There shall be a tapping fee in an amount equal to the actual cost to the City for every customer who connects with the sewer facilities of the System.
- (c) None of the sewer facilities or services afforded by the System shall be furnished without a charge being made therefor.
- Section 3. That the operation of the System shall be on a fully metered basis, with a meter installed at each water connection (except fire hydrants) when practical. There shall be only one user on a single connection. There shall be no dual connections: that is, there shall be no more than one user on a single meter. Each apartment in an apartment house shall be considered a separate user.
- Section 4. That a single statement will be submitted for monthly water and sewer charges. All bills for services of the System shall be rendered monthly in the net amount due and must be paid within ten (10) days from the date of rendition and if not so paid, a 10% penalty will be added. If any charge is not paid within 30 days after the same is due, the service can be disconnected and suit can be brought to collect the amount due, together with a reasonable attorney's fee, plus a penalty of 10%. A charge of \$1.00 plus the payment of all arrears shall be required before any premises so disconnected shall be again connected to the System.
- Section 5. That the provisions of this Ordinance are separable and if a section, phrase or provision shall be declared invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance.
- Section 6. That all ordinances and resolutions and parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

The City of Turrell in Arkansas owns and operates its water and sewer facilities as a single, interrelated municipal undertaking. The city has decided to extend and improve the system to ensure its residents have access to sufficient and proper water and sewer services.

The City Council has established monthly rates and charges for water services that are considered fair and reasonable, as well as minimum rates that should be charged for the provision of water through the system. This is in accordance with Ordinance No. 2002.3, Section 1.

The water usage of each customer will be measured monthly by a meter, and the amount to be paid will be determined based on the following rate schedule.

To ensure accurate measurement of water usage, a meter should be installed at every water connection point, excluding fire hydrants, whenever possible. Only one user should use each connection point, and dual connections are not allowed. In the case of multi-family housing, each apartment or house should be considered as a separate user. This is in accordance with Ordinance No. 2002, Sections 3 and 4.

Starting January 1, 2024, you will be billed for residential water and sewer usage based on the number of units. (Ordinance No. 2020.1006)

ORDINANCE NO. 2002-3

AN ORDINANCE FIXING RATES FOR SERVICES RENDERED BY THE WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF TURRELL, ARKANSAS; AND PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

WHEREAS, the City of Turrell, Arkansas (the "City") owns and operates water and sewer facilities, which water and sewer facilities are operated as one interrelated municipal undertaking (the "System"), and has determined that extensions, betterments and improvements to the System (the "improvements") should be made in order that the City and its inhabitants may have adequate and proper water and sewer facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has had prepared by a duly qualified consulting engineer a preliminary report and estimates of costs of the improvements, which have been examined and approved by the City Council and are on file with the City Recorder where they may be inspected by any interested person; and

WHEREAS, the costs will have to be paid from the proceeds of revenue bonds; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City to establish rates to be charged for the services of the System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Turrell, Arkansas:

- Section 1. That the following monthly rates and charges which the City Council hereby finds and declares are fair, reasonable and minimum rates to be charged for water services be, and they are hereby, fixed as rates for water services to be rendered by the System.
- (A) Monthly Water Rates. The water usage of each customer shall be determined each month by meter measurement and the amount to be paid by each customer shall be computed on the basis of the following schedule of rates:

Residential

For the first 1,500 gallons of water consumption per month, or portion thereof

B.00 (minimum)

The lowest rate per 1,000 gallons will be adjusted as necessary to assure the rate is greater than the Cost of Operation and maintenance per 1,000 gallons.

Commercial

Commercial users will be charged a flat rate each month as follows:

Commercial \$16.00 per month Schools \$43.00 per month + 6.00 Shop \$17.00 per month + 6.00

- (b) Tapping Fee. There shall be a tapping fee in an amount equal to the actual cost to the City for every customer who connects with the sewer facilities of the System.
- (c) None of the sewer facilities or services afforded by the System shall be furnished without a charge being made therefor.
- Section 3. That the operation of the System shall be on a fully metered basis, with a meter installed at each water connection (except fire hydrants) when practical. There shall be only one user on a single connection. There shall be no dual connections: that is, there shall be no more than one user on a single meter. Each apartment in an apartment house shall be considered a separate user.
- Section 4. That a single statement will be submitted for monthly water and sewer charges. All bills for services of the System shall be rendered monthly in the net amount due and must be paid within ten (10) days from the date of rendition and if not so paid, a 10% penalty will be added. If any charge is not paid within 30 days after the same is due, the service can be disconnected and suit can be brought to collect the amount due, together with a reasonable attorney's fee, plus a penalty of 10%. A charge of \$1.00 plus the payment of all arrears shall be required before any premises so disconnected shall be again connected to the System.
- Section 5. That the provisions of this Ordinance are separable and if a section, phrase or provision shall be declared invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance.
- Section 6. That all ordinances and resolutions and parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Commercial

Commercial users will be charged a flat rate each month as follows:

Commercial	\$19.00	per	month
Schools	\$68.10	per	month
Shop	\$19.00	per	month

- (b) None of the water facilities or services afforded by the System shall be furnished without a charge being made therefor.
- (c) Tapping Fee. There shall be a tapping fee in an amount equal to the actual cost to the City for every customer who connects with the water facilities of the System.
- (d) Meter Deposit. Each customer who connects with the System shall make a deposit with the City in the amount of \$ 70.00. Such deposit shall remain with the City until the customer closes his account or requests his water to be disconnected, at which time he will have his deposit returned, if he is not in arrears in his account with the City.
- Section 2. (a) That the following monthly rates and charges which the City Council hereby finds and declares are fair, reasonable and necessary minimum rates be, and they are hereby, fixed as rates to be charges for sewer services to be rendered by the System.
- (b) Monthly Sewer Rates. All sewer charges shall be based on water consumption and the amount to be paid by each customer shall be computed on the basis of the following schedule of rates:

Residential

For the first 1,500 gallons of water consumption per month, or portion thereof

\$7.40 (minimum)

The lowest rate per 1,000 gallons will be adjusted as necessary to assure the rate is greater than the cost of operation and maintenance per 1,000 gallons.
